



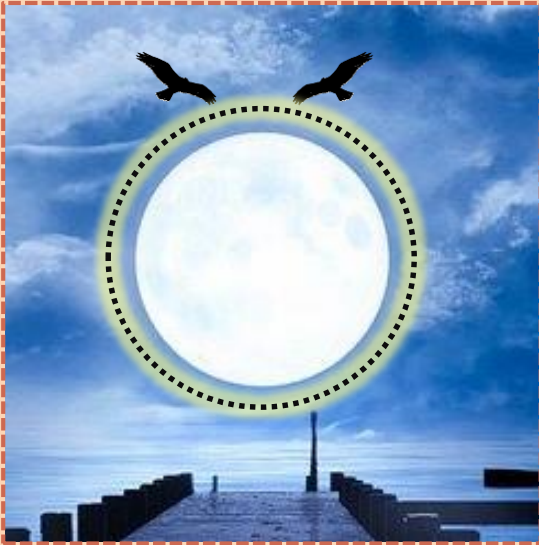

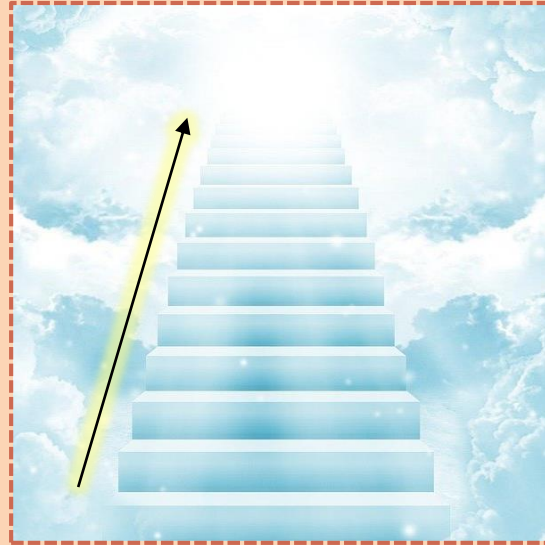

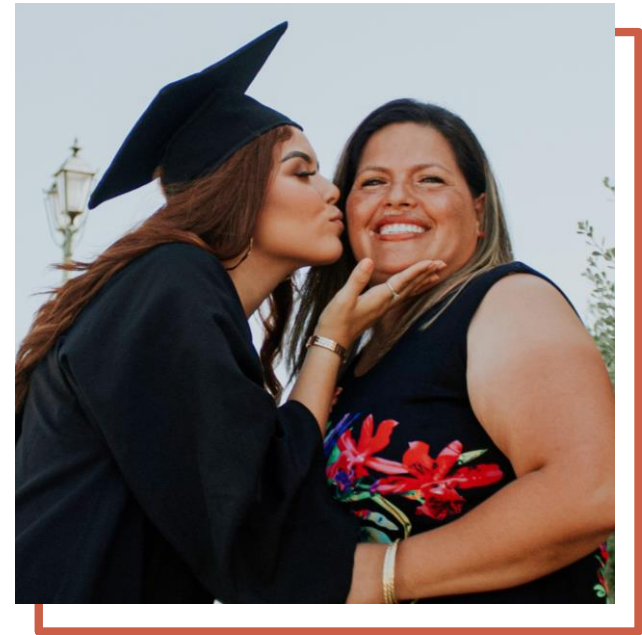
The concept of the idiom is based on the idea that when you are truly happy, you often feel as if you are floating in the air.

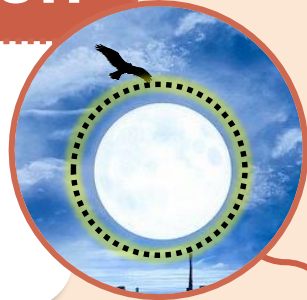

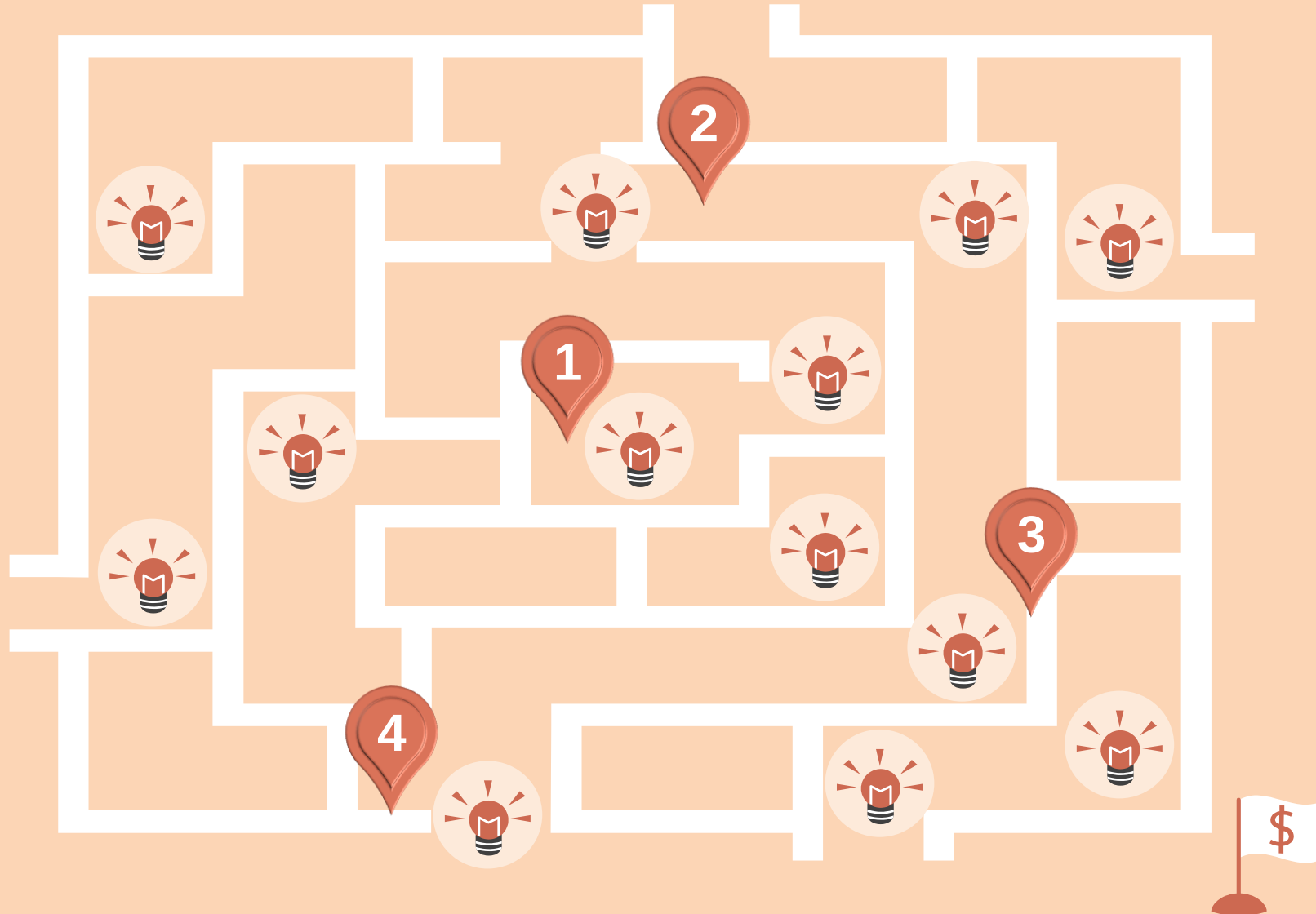
