


**Conversation for Idioms**

#### Origin

The precise origin of this idiom is unknown, although its figurative use is easy to understand. It may allude to a coin toss, since as long as the coin is still in the air, the outcome is unknown.

  - When do we use the idiom?

The idiom "on the fence" has been in use since the 1820s, and is taken from the image of a person straddling a fence, unable to decide whether he should jump down to the left or to the right.

- What things do you consider when making a decision?




