He's got a lot/ lots of jewellery.

much

He hasn't got much jewellery.
Has he got much jewellery?

a little

He's got a little jewellery.

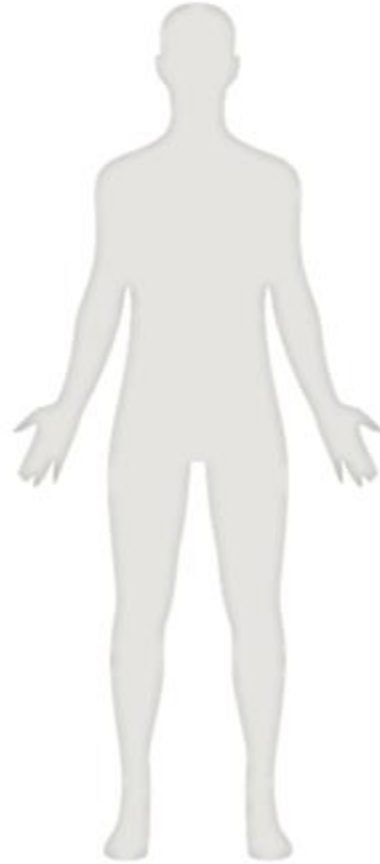

a lot of / lots of She's got **a lot/ lots of** shorts.

many She hasn't got **many** shorts.

a few She's got **a few** shorts.

much She hasn't got **much** jewellery.

a little She's got **a little** jewellery.

Indefinite Pronouns

Indefinite pronouns are words we use for unknown people or things.

Somebody is wearing pants.

somebody

something

somewhere

Nobody is wearing pants.

nobody

nothing

nowhere

Is **anybody** wearing pants?

anybody

anything

anywhere

✗ Everyone **sing**.
