- any She hasn't got any shorts.

a lot of / lots of She's got a lot/ lots of shorts.

- many She hasn't got many shorts.
- a few She's got a few shorts.
- much She hasn't got much jewellery.
- She's got a lot/lots of shorts. a little She's got a little jewellery.

Indefinite Pronouns

Indefinite pronouns are words we use for unknown people or things.

Somebody is wearing pants. Nobody is wearing pants. Is anybody wearing pants?

somebody	something	somewhere
nobody	nothing	nowhere
anybody	anything	anywhere
