verb + -er (indicates a person or thing performing the action of the verb)

drive – driver dispatch – dispatcher

**verb + -or** (indicates a person or thing performing an activity or having a particular function)

sail – sailor conduct – conductor

> cycle – cyclist pharmacy – pharmacist

#### Go vs Drive vs Ride vs Take

Go (used when we don't say the specific mode of transportation)

I want to go to the mall.

**Drive** (used to specifically refer to operating a vehicle, usually a car, as the driver)

I drive to work every day.

**Ride** (used when someone travels as a passenger, or for 2-wheel vehicles or on an animal)

They ride the bus to school.

**Take** (used when someone uses or chooses a specific mode or transportation)

I take the train to get to the city.






