




#### Semivowel Sound



## **IPA Symbols**

Don't get confused with the y-consonant IPA symbol /j/ and the letter 'j'. The IPA symbol of the letter 'j' sound is  $\frac{d_3}{.}$  The IPA symbol  $\frac{j}{i}$  is chosen for the y-consonant because it reflects its articulatory properties.
