a long-term working path you choose for your personal achievement.

example

Mark has a successful **career as a software engineer, working for various technology companies and eventually becoming a senior manager.**

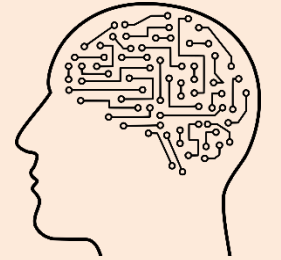

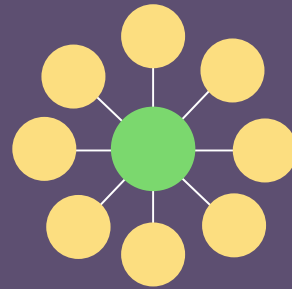

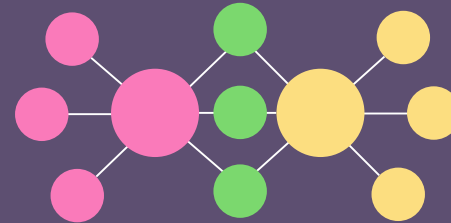

CIRCLE MAP



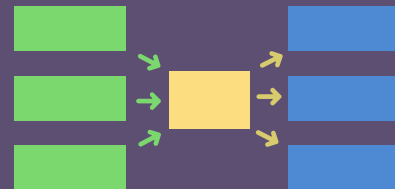
BUBBLE MAP



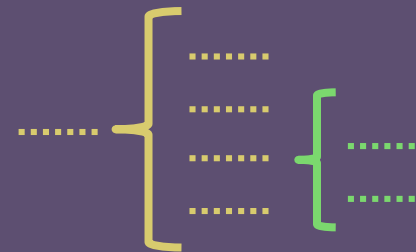
DOUBLE BUBBLE MAP
