We use the past simple for completed actions, events, and situations in the past.

- I visited my hometown last year.
- I **cleaned** my room yesterday.
- I saw the pyramids and then
 I went to the Cairo Museum.

Past Continuous

We use the past continuous:

• for a particular moment in the past:

I was cooking dinner at 6:00 in the evening.

- for an action happening when another action happened:
 She was cleaning his room when he arrived.
- for two or more actions happening at the same time:
 While she was dancing, he was singing.

Past Simple yesterday now X I

I stayed in the apartment yesterday.

= I stayed in the apartment yesterday but not now.

Past Continuous ... 4 pm ... 5 pm ... 6 pm ... now Image: I

I was staying in the apartment at 4 pm.

= I started staying in the apartment before 4 pm and continued to stay afterward.

TAKE A NOTE

When vs While

We use "when" and "while" to introduce an action happening at the same time as another.



We were baking <u>when</u> the phone rang.

"when" + short action (past simple)

The phone rang **while** we were baking.

"while" + longer action (past continuous)

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Past Simple

of for completed actions, events, and situations in the past:

I went to my uncle's house every week.

when + short action (past simple)

e.g. He was cleaning the room when he hurt his knee.

while + long action (past continuous)
e.g. He hurt his knee while he
was cleaning the table.

Past Continuous



for a particular moment in the past:

I was listening to the radio at 5 pm.



for an action happening when another action happened:

He was running when he saw me.

for two or more actions

happening at the same time: While he was studying, she was crying.
