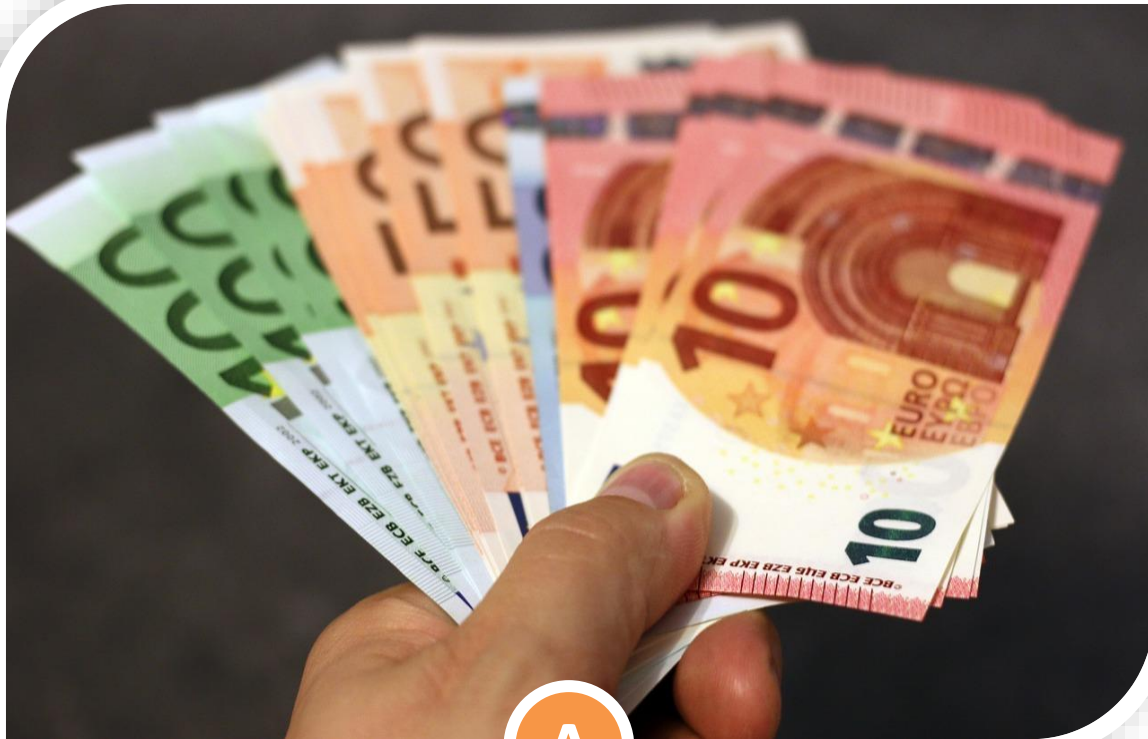

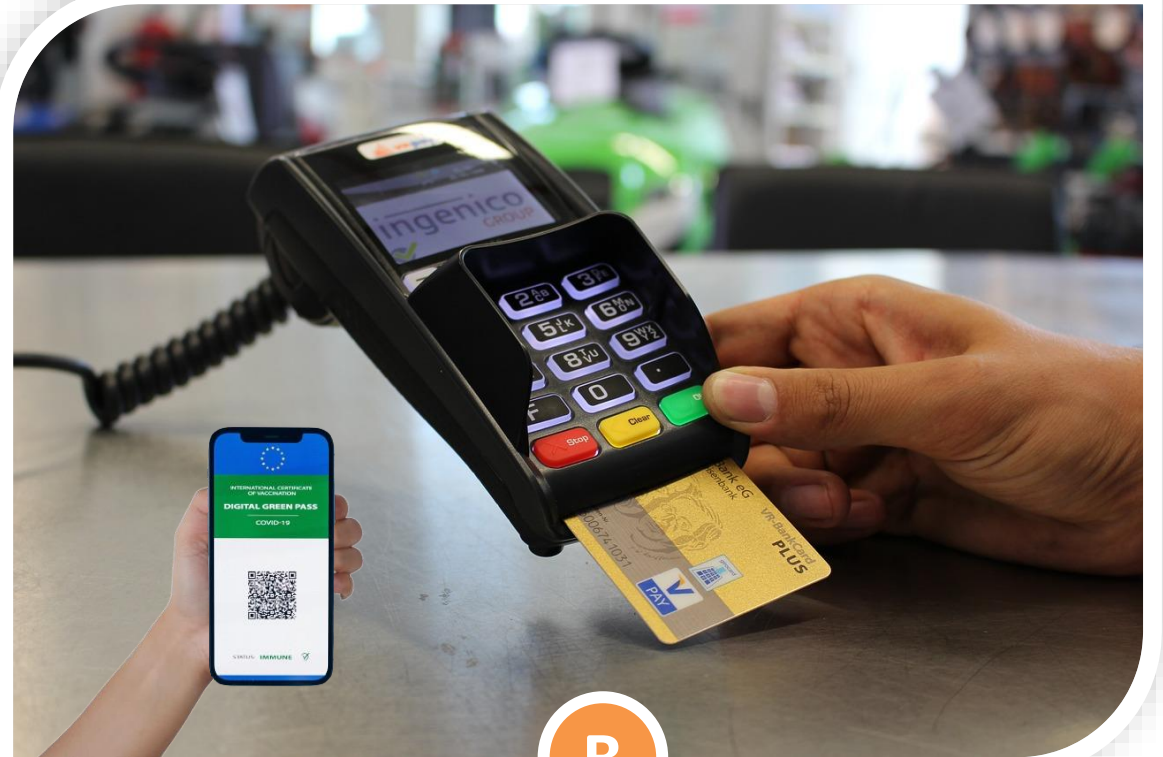
Here are two photographs showing two different methods of payment. Compare and answer.

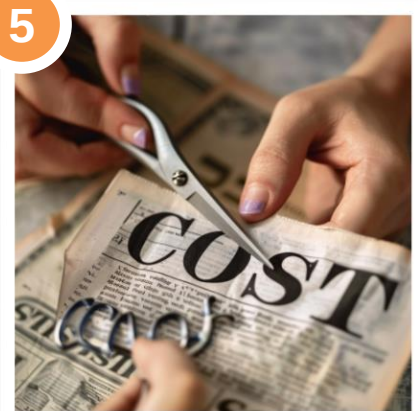
