## **GRAMMAR FOCUS**

#### must vs have to

## MUST is used for obligations we decide for other people or ourselves.



You must submit your report tomorrow. (The teacher decided this for the students.)



I must exercise more often. (Jack decided this for himself.)

#### **!** The speaker can change the rule.





We have to submit our report tomorrow. (The teacher made this rule.)



I have to present my train ticket. (The train company made this rule.)

#### 1 The speaker can't change the rule.

#### should vs need to

**Should** is used for recommendations and to express what is right to do.

Julie should spend less time watching TV. (It's the right thing to do but she doesn't do it.)

We shouldn't eat too much fast food.

(It isn't the right thing to do but we still do it.)

**Need to** is used for something that is necessary for a specific purpose.

Gina needs to take a break and relax. (It's necessary because she is tired.)

They need to save money for their vacation.

(It's necessary so they can pay for their vacation.)
