# Present the Grammar

## Past tense of verbs

simple  
present

My family **goes** to Japan **every** summer.



simple  
past

My family **went** to Japan **last** week.

*Note*

The past simple often ends in -ed. E.g., worked, played, ...

But some verbs are not like this.

*More examples*

do – **did**, am/ is – **was**, are – **were**, buy – **bought**, eat – ate, ...

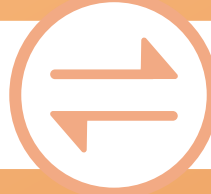

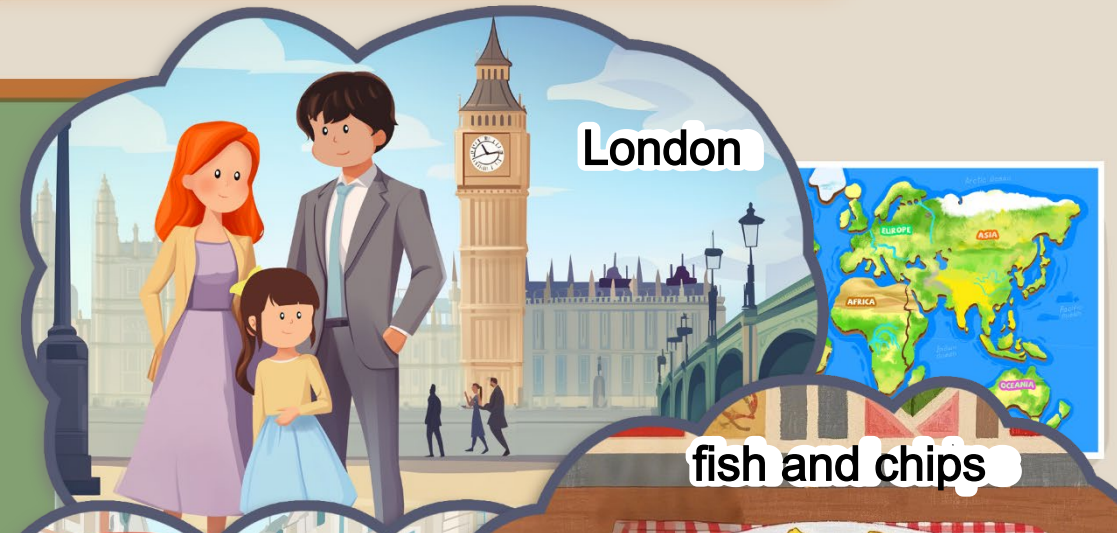
