

I'd like (to)...

I'd like + noun

I'd like some salmon.



= I want some salmon.



I'd like + to + verb + noun

I'd like to have some salmon.




= I want to have some salmon.


Note:

- a. I'd = I would
- b. It is more polite to use <u>I'd like (to)</u> ... instead of <u>I want (to)</u>...


