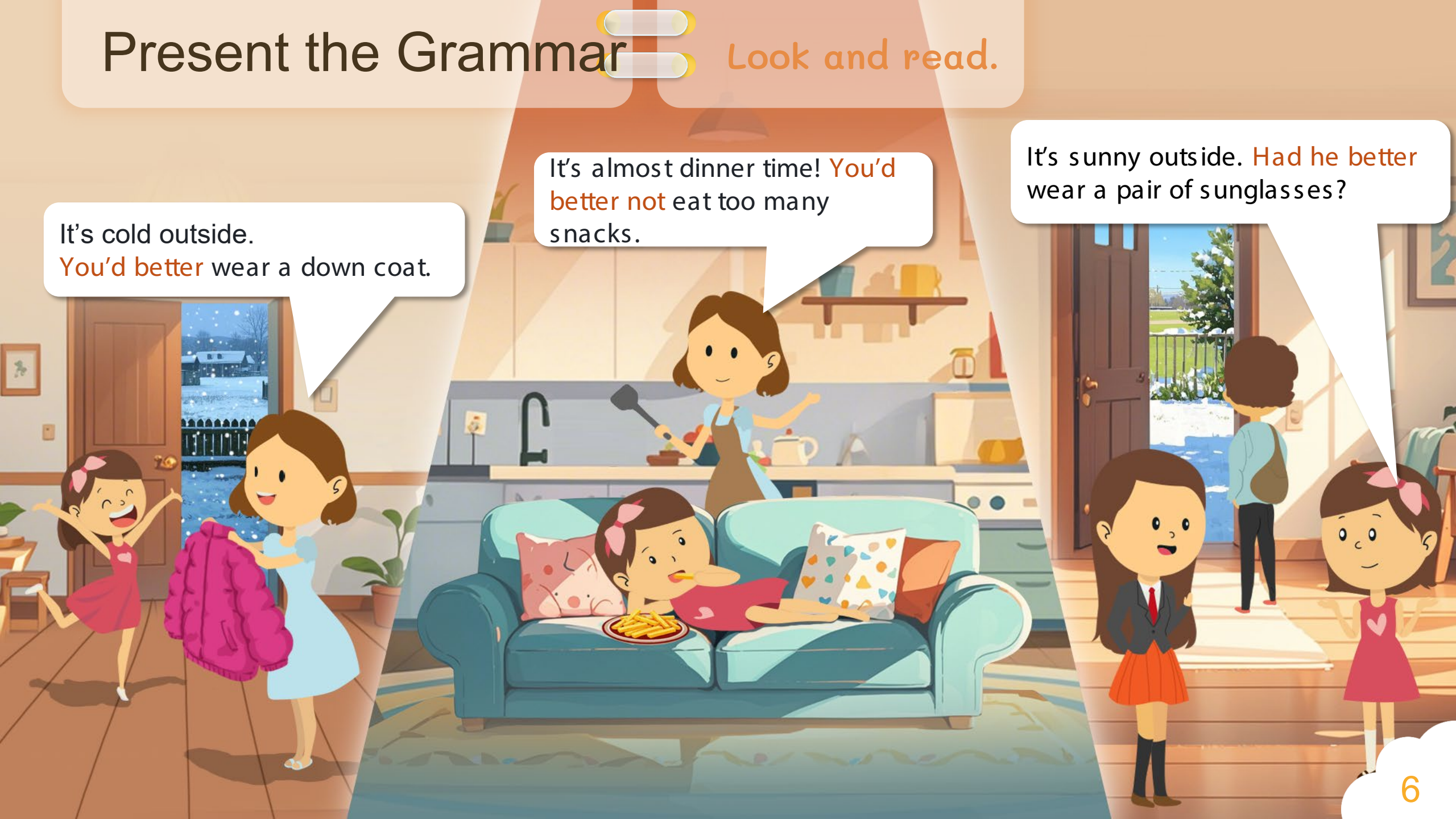
Present the Grammar

Look and read.

It's cold outside.
You'd better wear a down coat.

It's almost dinner time! You'd better not eat too many snacks.

It's sunny outside. Had he better wear a pair of sunglasses?



Present the Grammar

had better...

had better + do

You'd better wear a down coat.

(= It would be a good idea to wear a down coat.)



had better + not + do

You'd better not eat too many snacks.

(= It would be a bad idea to eat so many snacks.)



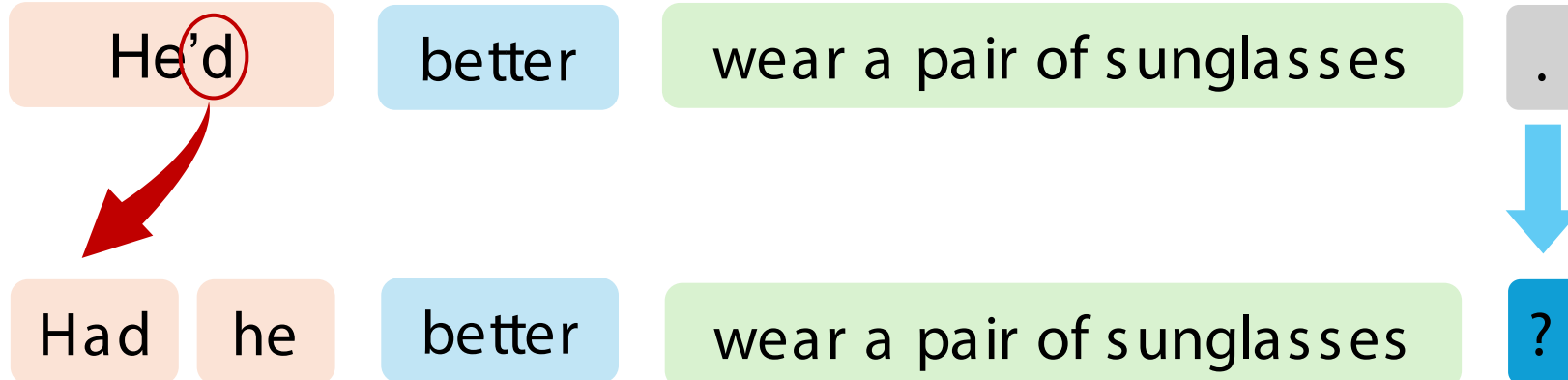
Note:

a. 'd better = had better

b. "You'd better wear a down coat." is a stronger suggestion than "You should wear a down coat."

Present the Grammar

Question: *Had... better...?*



Yes, he **had better**.

No, he **hadn't better**.

More examples

Had they better go by taxi?

Had she better drink more water?

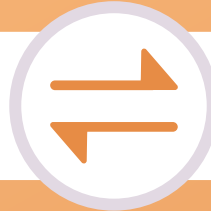

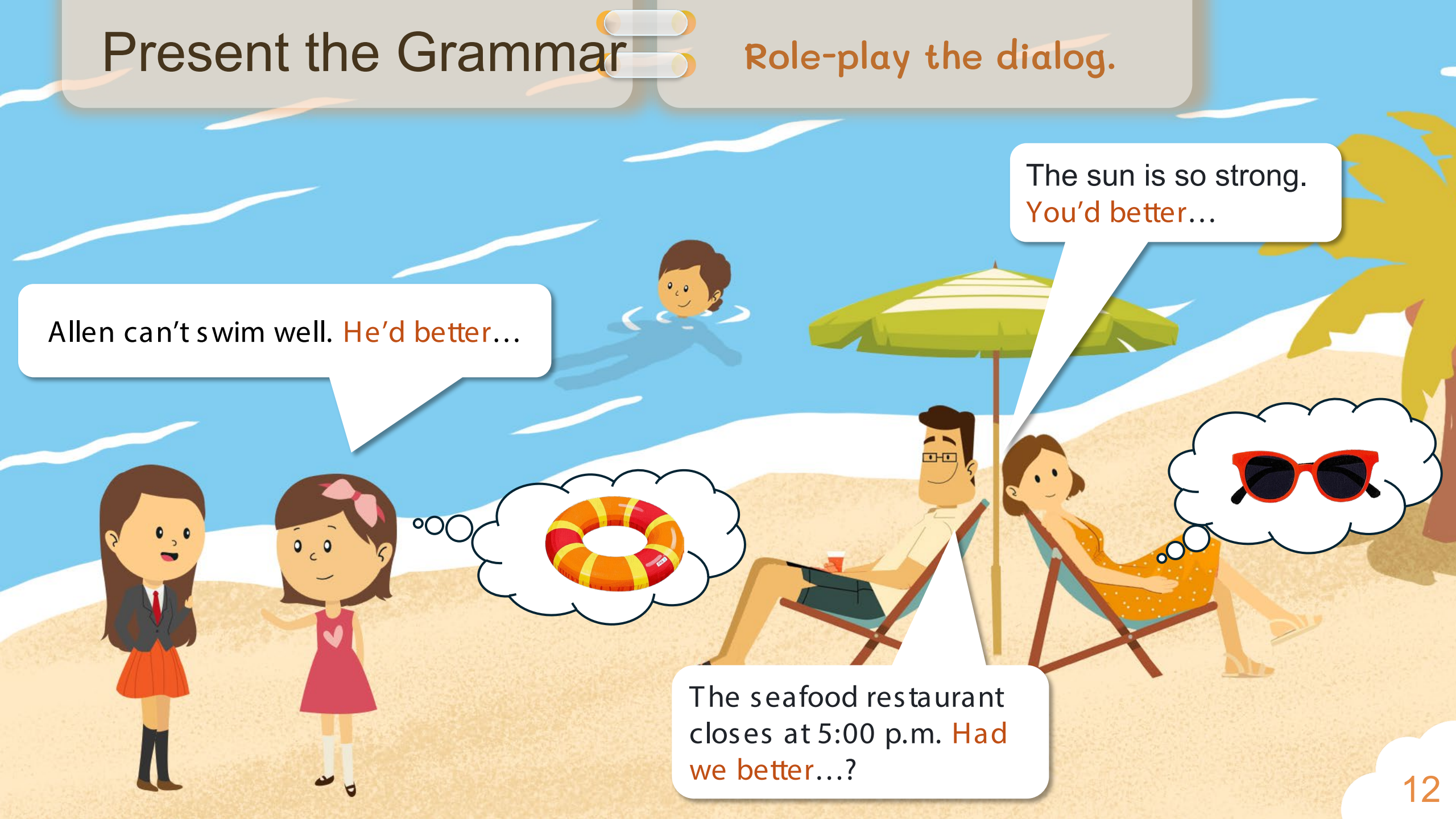
