Step 1

- **Case 1.** Check the four answer choices

 If you find such correlative conjunctions as both/ either/ neither/ and / or/ nor/ but/ whether,
- Case 2. Check before the blank

 → If you find such coordinating conjunctions as and / or/ but, the question typically asks

Step 2

- **Case 1.** Look for the little brother in the correlative pair.
 - E.g. both X and Y/ not X but Y/ either X or Y/ not only X but also Y (but Y as well)/ neither X nor Y/ whether X or Y

about "Parallel Structure".

- Case 2. The elements connected by these conjunctions are parallel: that is, similar in grammatical form. So look for parallel word(s). The form of parallel structure, in which unnecessary words are omitted but are understood, is termed 'ellipsis'.
 - E.g. Mary opened the door and Mary greeted her guests. → Mary opened the door and greeted her guests.
