☆ Yes/No Questions (2)

If the item begins with a <u>modal auxiliary</u> (such as *can, may, will, should, must,* etc.), or with a <u>negative auxiliary</u> (such as *can't, shouldn't,* etc.), the question is a yes/no question. The answer will usually begin with *yes* or *no*, but sometimes the *yes* or *no* is understood.

E. g. Aren't you coming for dinner tonight? (Yes) I'll be there.

☆ Choice Questions (1)

Choice questions ask about preferences.

Choice questions present the choices using the word 'or'.

They are a type of information question and shouldn't be answered with yes or no.

E.g. Do you want me to send the letter now, or will you do it later?

 \times Yes, I do. \times No, I don't.

✓I'll do it later.
