(b) : <u>Active vs Passive</u>/ <u>Subject-Verb Agreement</u> →<u>20 seconds</u>

Step 1

First of all, check the <u>four answer choices</u> \rightarrow If you see different forms of the same verb, the question typically asks about the "Verb Form".

Step 2

• If the answer choices include different Participles (e.g. present participle, past participle), check the voice (Active Voice; Passive Voice)

• If the answer choices include both third-person-singular-case verbs and other case-verbs, check the Subject-Verb Agreement.

NB One of the main distractors for Subject-Verb Agreement items is 'Window Dressing'.

a. by inserting a prepositional phrase immediately after the Subject (P4)

b. by inserting a relative immediately after the Subject (P3)

c. by inserting a subordinate clause immediately after the Subject (P5)

The purpose is to create some distance between the Subject and the Verb.
