DEFINITION

The word **travel** is generally used as a verb, which means to go to another place in general.

It can also be used <u>as a noun</u> to mean the act of traveling in general, and <u>as an adjective</u> to describe something that is related to travel.

LANGUAGE POINTS

What is the difference between the nouns trip, journey, tour and voyage?

trip (noun)

- the act of going to another place, often for a short period of time, and returning, for a purpose, business or pleasure

journey (noun)

- the distance covered when travelling from one place to another, usually refers to a long distance or a short regular one

tour (can be used as a noun and a verb)

- is a journey during which several places are visited, especially on a holiday

voyage (noun)

- is a long journey by sea or in space
