What other kinds of book do you know of?

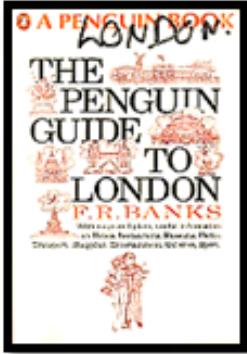
DEFINITION

A **bookworm** is someone who enjoys and spends a lot of time reading books. The term, which generally refers to a type of worm that feeds on paper, has been used metaphorically to refer to someone who always has their nose in a book.

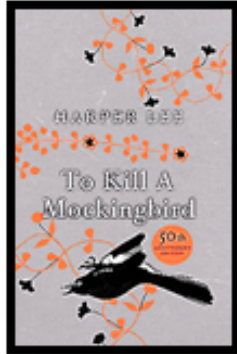

LANGUAGE POINT

The **Present Simple** tense of the verb is often used when retelling the story of a book or film.

Examples:

Harry **sets** off with Ron and Hermione on a difficult quest to defeat Voldemort. (Harry Potter)

Nick **learns** that Jay Gatsby knew Daisy is deeply in love with her. (The Great Gatsby)

Here are Adjectives which are useful when describing a book you have read or even a film that you have seen.

Adjectives that can be used when describing a book:

Positive

amusing captivating
hilarious comprehensible
deep informative
enjoyable brilliant
entertaining well-written

Negative

boring confusing
uninformative silly
predictable inaccurate
incomprehensible
hard-to-read
