

## FOOD LOVER (Gourmand)

### DEFINITION

A **gourmand** /GOR - mænd/ is a formal word which is used to describe someone who is very enthusiastic about food and drinks. They enjoy both eating and cooking food. They tend to eat and drink more than they need. In informal English, we can refer to them as “**foodie**” meaning “food lover”.
