### What to avoid

The most <u>common</u> mistake with presentations is trying to <u>cram</u> in too much information – you either <u>end</u> up talking too fast, or <u>overrunning</u> the time limit.

Start with an <u>introduction</u> that sets out the structure, followed by the main body <u>consisting</u> of 3 (or 4) main points, each followed by <u>evidence</u> to support these, and finish with a brief summarizing conclusion.

### Supporting information

Choose your supporting information carefully. This helps your <u>audience</u> understand, believe in and agree with your main points. This evidence might take the form of <u>factual</u> data, points of detail or an <u>explanation</u> of process. It might be presented in <u>imaginative</u> ways using <u>visuals</u>. Think about:

- what will add *clarity* to your argument (explaining complex terms)?
- what will add <u>authority</u> to your argument (quoting experts)?
- what will add <u>color</u> to your argument (showing a video clip or a slide)?
