

IELTS Speaking Day 2

Part 2 Overview

In Part 2 of the IELTS Speaking Test, the candidate is given 1 minute to prepare for answers and 2 minutes for the long turn. This is the examiner's chance to listen and assess your skill carefully in English. The examiner has a rough idea of your band score after your talk in Part 2. Language ability will be tested if you try to add more information and details to each of the prompt. For vocabulary and fluency, description is a must. Don't forget to give examples of the past and ideas for the future can offer more grammar tenses.

Do's and Don'ts for PART 2

- ✓ Do not try to change the topic. Topics in PART 2 can be difficult and most examinees don't have enough idea about it. However, you still have to try your best to talk by adding some ideas and examples.
- ✓ When writing notes during given preparation time, write ideas that are useful for your talk.
- ✓ Although you have notes, do not look at it all time, just glance. Make sure to have eye contact with the examiner.
- ✓ Sub-questions in the topic card are guidelines for you to have an organized talk.
- ✓ As much as possible, the length of your talk should be 2 minutes.
