IELTS Speaking Day 4

In the final part of the IELTS speaking test the examiner will have a discussion with you about topics related to Part 2. The questions in this part are of a more abstract nature and so are more difficult than the questions in Parts 1 and 2. Because of this, <u>some examinees find some Part 3 questions to be</u>:

- a. difficult to understand or a bit confusing
- b. mental-block inducing, disabling them from coming up with an answer
- c. hard to elaborate on

In order to help you get a bit more comfortable with Part 3 questions, we'd like to remind you of the following facts:

- The questions don't need any expert knowledge about the topic being discussed. Even though it may be more academic, it's general enough that you'd be able to relate to it on some level.
- Examiners are there only to hear how well you can deliver your response on more abstract questions.
- If you don't understand what the examiner asked you, politely ask him to repeat the question or <u>define</u> a word you're not familiar with. You may want to do this only <u>once</u> though or risk your score in lexical resource.
